If you don't want your equine friend to be turned out, make sure you have that red tag on your door. If they're not going to be in their stall for any reason and are away from the farm, we need that indicated with a green tag on the stall. This is just for safety of your horses. We wouldn't want anyone going on any unsupervised outings.

Second, to ensure the best care for your horses please make sure that if you have any medications or supplements that need to be administered they need to be given to the office. If they are given to the grooms, we will not be able to check up on it and make sure they are given as needed.

Safety is of the highest importance to all of us here at Sunflower Farms. Bearing that in mind, please heed this very important rule: there is to be no jumping

at anytime without being under the supervision of a trainer.

Beginning in April 2009, we will be putting into effect a new billing system that we are hoping will be more boarder friendly. We will have more details as we get closer to that time. Also, keep in mind, we will be putting deposits in on a weekly basis rather than two times a month as before.

Show season is rapidly approaching. This is just a reminder for all of you who participate and compete, in the state of Wisconsin; coggins are only good for a calendar year. Please remember to update coggins for 2009 as soon as possible, so you are not caught without them once show time is here!
